FOOD DRIVE~ Our 6th Annual Food Drive will begin on Wednesday, November 1st and end on Thursday, November 16th. All donations will be delivered to the Beach Community Food Pantry at the Calvary Episcopal Church in Indian Rocks Beach. Please drop off your non-perishable food at Town Hall. Thank you for continuing to make our annual food drive a huge success.

PUBLIC SAFETY~ As the weather breaks, more of our residents are out and about the town. Here are a few public safety tips to remember: Please drive slowly throughout the town. When you are walking, always walk on the side of the road facing the vehicle traffic. At night, always carry a flashlight and dress in bright colors. When riding your bicycle, you should ride with the traffic flow. When crossing Gulf Boulevard always use the crosswalks with the lights - watch the cars to make sure they stop before you begin walking. And always remember to lock all your house doors, keep your garage closed and to lock your vehicles each night. Please protect yourself, your family and your property.

DISASTER PLAN~ Have a plan in place in case of a disaster in our area. Read about tips for preparedness in the Pinellas County All Hazards Guide available at Town Hall and other government offices. It is also available on the town's website. Educate yourself about the effects storm surge and high winds have on our island. When we all work together the results are better than going at it alone.

ANIMALS~ Please remember that all pets must be on leashes unless in a fenced yard. We have received numerous calls regarding unleashed dogs in streets and in the parks. Deputies are reminding residents of the leash law and issuing citations when necessary.

PROPOSED PUBLIC WORKS BUILDING~ The architectural drawings have been completed by Pinellas County for the new public works building that will also include an emergency response center. The building will include a fire house substation, a sheriff's office substation, public works storage for both North Redington Beach and Redington Shores, public records storage and an election room for voting. The first phase will be moving the Pinellas County sewer lift station to the west side of the property. This project will be funded by the county's portion of the Penny for Pinellas. The plans are available at Town Hall for review.

BEACH NOURISHMENT PROJECT~ The beach nourishment project is still on schedule to begin at the end of this calendar year and should be completed by April/May of 2018. The timing couldn't be more perfect because of all of the storms that have eroded our beaches. Thank you to all the properties that are participating in the nourishment by granting easements to the Army Corps of Engineers.
