



**TOWN OF NORTH REDINGTON BEACH
BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS REGULAR MEETING
MAY 13TH, 2010 MINUTES**

CALL TO ORDER

Mayor Queen called the May 13th, 2010 meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. The meeting was held at the Town Hall building, 190 - 173rd Avenue, North Redington Beach, Florida

- 1. ORDINANCE NO. 2010-691 AN ORDINANCE PERTAINING DOCKS AND PIERS; AMENDING SECTION 98-361 TO ALLOW BOAT LIFTS TO EXTEND FIFTY-FOUR (54) FEET; PROVIDING FOR INCLUSION IN THE CODE; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE. FIRST READING.**

Commissioner Blocker made a motion to approve Ordinance no. 2010-691. Commissioner Curtis seconded the motion. Mayor Queen stated this was an addition of the words boat lift to the existing ordinance. Commissioners Blocker and Curtis explained it did not change the ordinance as the wording only clarified the intent. There was no public input.

2. **ORDINANCE NO. 2010-692 AN ORDINANCE PERTAINING TO ELECTIONS; PROVIDING FOR NOTICE OF ELECTION TO BE IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE FLORIDA ELECTION CODE; PROVIDING FOR INCLUSION IN THE CODE; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE. FIRST READING.**

Vice Mayor Knight made a motion to approve Ordinance no. 2010-692. Commissioner Blocker seconded the motion. Mayor Queen explained this was a change to allow the election advertising to follow the State statutes thereby saving the Town money. There was no public input.

3. **ORDINANCE NO. 2010-693 AN ORDINANCE PERTAINING TO SOLICITATION; AMENDING SECTION 54-2 TO PROHIBIT THE SOLICITATION OF SERVICES; PROVIDING FOR INCLUSION IN THE CODE; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE. FIRST READING.**

Commissioner Blocker made a motion to approve Ordinance no. 2010-693. Commissioner Curtis seconded the motion. Mayor Queen stated that by adding services to the ordinance it would prevent door to door solicitation of lawn, painting, cleaning, etc. services where the current ordinance only pertained to the selling of merchandise.
