Change to Garbage Service~

Our garbage service contract will expire on March 31, 2019. Two companies gave proposals with the Board voting to move the contract to Waste Pro. The new contract is for curbside pickup for both garbage and recycling. Back door service is available at an extra cost. The new cost is a reduction to residential rates from \$16.30 per month to \$15.78. However, commercial accounts will see an increase due to those rates having had very little increase since the original 2007 contract. More information will be provided to you by Waste Pro in the near future.

Town Updates~

The Gulf Boulevard Beautification Project began in January. This project will underground the power, cable and telephone lines on the east side of Gulf Boulevard and new light poles will be installed. The Barrier Islands Governmental Council (BIG-C) is also working closely with Pinellas County to underground the west side of Gulf Boulevard within the next three years.

The Emergency Services/Public Works Building permits should be issued with possible ground breaking by the end of the year.

The Redington Village Project (old wine cellar property) is moving along slowly. The owner and developer will keep us updated on the timeline.

The Sandalwood Resort has been sold and is in the process of a rehab. The new owners are planning a reopen by the year's end.

Pinellas County has filed a lawsuit against the Redington Long Pier to force demolition. As the pier breaks apart it has become a safety hazard for the neighboring beaches.
