NEW BUSINESS

- 1. ORDINANCE NO. 2019 – 809 AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWN OF NORTH REDINGTON BEACH, FLORIDA, AMENDING § 66-45 OF THE TOWN CODE CONCERNING ADMINISTRATIVE INSPECTIONS OF LICENSED BUSINESSES; MAKING RELATED FINDINGS; AND PROVIDING FOR CODIFICATION, SEVERABILITY, AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE. FIRST READING.**

Vice Mayor Bennett made a motion to approve Ordinance 2019-809. Commissioner Kennedy seconded the motion. Town Attorney Daigneault explained the revision to the ordinance was a result of the judge's findings in the Sweet Sage lawsuit. There was no public input.

2. ORDINANCE NO. 2019 – 810 AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWN OF NORTH REDINGTON BEACH, FLORIDA, CREATING § 30-1 AND § 30-2 OF THE TOWN CODE CONCERNING THE DISTRIBUTION OF UNSOLICITED PRINTED MATERIALS; MAKING RELATED FINDINGS; AND PROVIDING FOR CODIFICATION, SEVERABILITY, AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE. FIRST READING.

Vice Mayor Bennett made a motion to approve Ordinance 2019-810. Commissioner Kennedy seconded the motion. Town Attorney Daigneault explained the ordinance replaced the prior solicitation ordinance which was not constitutional. Since the Town cannot ban solicitation, the new ordinance outlines how it can and cannot be done. He went on to explain the Beach Beacon would not be able to deliver their weekly paper based on the proposed ordinance without excising the portion related to "thrown from vehicles". After discussion, the Commission agreed to remove that portion from the proposed ordinance.

Commissioner Kennedy made a motion to approve Ordinance 2019-810 as amended per the discussion. Commissioner Thornton seconded the motion.
