Holiday Events~ Unfortunately, the Holiday Tree Lighting will be cancelled again this year due to COVID precautions. Election Qualifying~ Qualifying for Commissioner Seats 3 and 4, currently held by Corey Thornton and Kevin Kennedy, will open on Friday, December 3th at 8:00 a.m. and close on Friday, December 17th at 1:00 p.m. The election will be on March 15th, 2022.

Outdoor Lighting Reminder~ Town ordinance requires all dock and home lighting to be either shielded down or turned off at night. This prevents light from shining into neighboring homes as well as those across the water.

Frontier Fios~ Fios high speed cable is coming to the beaches. The digging, trenching and work you see on our residential streets is Frontier installing Fios fiber optic cabling. It is projected to take several weeks to complete this project. Frontier Communications has promised to restore all property to its original condition after completion of the work. Flood Insurance~ The National Flood Insurance Program has begun to outline it's new pricing structure and it is not good news. The Town appealed these changes when they were first revealed in 2019, but our appeal was denied. FEMA indicates this new pricing structure will improve equity and help policy holders better understand how to manage their flood risk. A presentation was given to the BIG-C regarding this new assessment and how these new policies along with the type of structure, would increase flood policies to homeowners. The newer the structure and more valuable the residence, the policy amount could increase, even if the new structure is built above base flood elevation. Contact your insurance company for any questions on policy increases. We will continue to monitor the implementation.
