

TOWN OF NORTH REDINGTON BEACH BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS REGULAR MEETING APRIL 14^{TH} , 2022

CALL TO ORDER

Mayor Queen called the April 14th, 2022 meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. The meeting was held at the Town Hall building, 190 - 173rd Avenue, North Redington Beach, Florida.

OLD BUSINESS

1. ORDINANCE NO. 2022-843 AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWN OF NORTH REDINGTON BEACH, FLORIDA, AMENDING SECTION 2-146 OF DIVISION 1 OF ARTICLE V OF CHAPTER 2 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES TO ALLOW FOR WORK OR SERVICES CONTRACTED FOR CALLING FOR THE EXPENDITURE OF \$50,000.00 OR MORE TO BE LET TO THE LOWEST AND/OR BEST BIDDER AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE. SECOND AND FINAL READING

Commissioner Bennett made a motion to approve Ordinance 2022-843. Commissioner Thornton seconded the motion. The Board discussed that costs continue to increase and small, quickly needed jobs were exceeding the current threshold for RFP's. There was no public input.

2. ORDINANCE NO. 2022-844 AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWN OF NORTH REDINGTON BEACH, FLORIDA, AMENDING SECTION 86-5 (15) OF CHAPTER 86 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES TO PROHIBIT FLAGPOLES ON FRONT AND SIDE SETBACKS AND TO PERMIT FLAGPOLES ON DOCKS, AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE. SECOND AND FINAL READING

Commissioner Bennett made a motion to approve Ordinance 2022-844. Commissioner Thornton seconded the motion. Mayor Queen explained this was discussed at the workshop and agreed that flagpoles should not be in the front or side setbacks. There was no public input.

3. ORDINANCE NO. 2022-845 AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWN OF NORTH REDINGTON BEACH, FLORIDA, AMENDING SECTION 98-219 OF CHAPTER 98 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES TO PERMIT SHEDS COMPRISED OF MATERIALS OTHER THAN METAL, AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE. SECOND AND FINAL READING

Vice Mayor Kennedy made a motion to approve Ordinance 2022-845. Commissioner Thornton seconded the motion. Mayor Queen explained the change was made as the majority of sheds in the town were already constructed from plastic. There was no public input.

ORDINANCE NO. 2022-846 AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWN OF NORTH REDINGTON BEACH, FLORIDA, AMENDING SECTION 98-362 OF CHAPTER 98 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES TO ALLOW FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF SWIMMING POOLS WITHIN THE REAR SETBACK ON WATERFRONT PROPERTIES, AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE. SECOND AND FINAL READING

Commissioner Bennett made a motion to approve Ordinance 2022-846. Commissioner Thornton seconded the motion. Mayor Queen explained the Building Official recommended the

change to ordinance as pools have always been allowed in the rear setback in all the zoning districts. There was no public input.

5. ORDINANCE NO. 2022-847 AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWN OF NORTH REDINGTON BEACH, FLORIDA, AMENDING SECTION 98-368 (b) OF CHAPTER 98 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES TO ELIMINATE MAXIMUM DRIVEWAY WIDTH, AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE. SECOND AND FINAL READING

Commissioner Bennett made a motion to approve Ordinance 2022-847. Vice Mayor Kennedy seconded the motion. The Board discussed that there was no need for a limit as long as pervious/impervious surface ratio was met. There was no public input.

1. ORDINANCE NO. 2022-848 AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWN OF NORTH REDINGTON BEACH, FLORIDA, AMENDING SECTION 98-369 OF CHAPTER 98, ARTICLE VI, DIVISION 1 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES TO PERMIT PERMANENT PLAYGROUND EQUIPMENT BEHIND A PARCEL'S PRINCIPAL STRUCTURE AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE. FIRST READING

Commissioner Thornton made a motion to approve Ordinance 2022-848. Commissioner Bennett seconded the motion. Mayor Queen explained this amendment was from the workshop. The amendment requires any permanently fixed playground equipment to be in the buildable area. There was no public input.

2. ORDINANCE NO. 2022-849 AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWN OF NORTH REDINGTON BEACH, FLORIDA, AMENDING SECTION 86-3 OF CHAPTER 86, OF

THE CODE OF ORDINANCES AMENDING THE DEFINITION OF THE TERM "SIGN" AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE. FIRST READING

Commissioner Bennett made a motion to approve Ordinance 2022-848. Commissioner Thornton seconded the motion. The Board discussed the need to add mural to the definition of sign so windows could not be covered more than 50%. There was no public input.

3. ORDINANCE NO. 2022-850 AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWN OF NORTH REDINGTON BEACH, FLORIDA, CREATING SECTION 42-6 OF THE TOWN CODE CONCERNING RENTAL OF RESIDENTIAL AMENITIES; PROVIDING FOR CODIFICATION, SEVERABILITY, AND FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE. FIRST READING

Vice Mayor Kennedy made a motion to approve Ordinance 2022-850. Commissioner Bennett seconded the motion. Town Attorney Daigneault explained this was the ordinance he had mentioned at a previous meeting. The ordinance would make it illegal to rent out any part of a property, such as a swimming pool or dock. There was no public input.
