MISCELLANEOUS

Mayor Queen gave an overview of the damage from Hurricane Idalia stating that the only real damage was to the beach and beach accesses. He said the water had lifted and broken the concrete on the pedestrian walkway north of the Tides and it was in the process of getting estimates for repair.

Commissioner Curtis asked if having more flapper valves on the drains would help with the type of flooding that occurred during Idalia. Mayor Queen stated that the water came over the seawall in many places and from the beach, which was pushed into the streets.

Commissioner Curtis asked Town Attorney Daigneault about the business impact legislation which goes into effect on Oct. 1st. Town Attorney Daigneault stated that it was going to be a trial and error type situation as the legislation does not include any parameters as to what is to be included in the studies.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned at 6:28 pm.
