Final Debris Pick up

The final debris pickup will occur next week. We have not been notified which day so make sure you have all of your debris out by Monday.

- Any debris after this time will be the responsibility of the property owner to remove
- Appliances will be picked up during the run.
- Debris piles smaller than 5 cubic yards (the size of a washer/dryer side by side) will not be collected. You have the option of combining small debris piles with neighbors, with their permission, to create a larger pile that would be removed **or** dispose of the items through other means such as a contractor or if small items, placed in bins for collection by the normal garbage hauler.
- Hired contractors are required to have a demolition dumpster on site for any construction items. Items that are not considered storm related debris, and will not be removed, includes tiles, pavers or any items not damaged by water or wind that is removed during the renovation process.
- There will be some small debris remaining after piles are removed. It is impossible for the large machinery to collect smaller things. This is the responsibility of the property owner.
- Do not bag any items.
- If you have damage from the use of the heavy machinery, please forward photos and contact information to townclerk@townofnrb.com. We will forward the information to Phillips and Jordan for review.

Substantial Damage Letters

The Building Official as confirmed that the substantial damage inspection estimates has started coming in. The first letters will be sent today and will continue as the estimates are received.

Previously, the decision to put forward an application was solely at the discretion of the local government, however, there is an upcoming opportunity for homeowners to apply directly with the State for structural elevations and acquisition.
