MEET YOUR COMMISSION

Mayor Jay Super and Commissioners Steve Bradley and Rick Nagrabski were sworn in at the March 13th town meeting. They join our current Commissioners Corey Thornton and Kevin Kennedy. Read on for a little background on your elected officials:
