**OLD BUSINESS**

- 1. ORDINANCE NO 2026-888 AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWN OF NORTH REDINGTON BEACH, FLORIDA, ADDING SECTION 62-62 TO ARTICLE III OF CHAPTER 62 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES TO PROHIBIT THE OPERATION OF ELECTRIC BICYCLES ON THE TOWN'S SIDEWALKS AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE. SECOND AND FINAL READING**

Commissioner Messmore made a motion to approve Ordinance No 2026-888, Commissioner Thornton seconded the motion.

**NEW BUSINESS**

- 1. ORDINANCE NO 2026-889 AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWN OF NORTH REDINGTON BEACH, FLORIDA, AMENDING SECTION 6-3 OF CHAPTER 6 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES TO MODIFY THE PROVISIONS FOR ON-PREMISES CONSUMPTION OF BEER, WINE, OR LIQUOR OUTSIDE OF A PERMANENT STRUCTURE, AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE. FIRST READING**

Vice Mayor Kennedy made a motion to approve Ordinance No 2026-889, Commissioner Nagrabski seconded the motion.

Town Attorney Daigneault explained the current ordinance required fencing on all four sides to allow for outside dining. However, enclosing all four sides for businesses in a multi business location such as the Redington Plaza, it is impossible to enclose all sides. This amendment will allow for them to have outside service by placing a fence/wall along the walkway to separate the parking area. There was no public input. A roll call vote was taken.


