BE A GOOD BOATING NEIGHBOR

We have been receiving complaints of boats causing wakes too close to the docks and playing excessively loud music late at night and in the early morning hours. As a reminder, it is illegal to create any wake in the following area:

- Within 100 feet of any person engaged in the act of bathing or swimming.
- Within 50 feet of any dock, pier, seawall, piling or bulkhead.
- Within 50 feet of any person engaged in fishing such waters.
- Within the no-anchoring zone as described in [section 74-66](#).

Also, the noise ordinance is in effect from 10:30 pm til 8:00 am. Please be courteous of your neighbors while enjoying the waterways.

We also ask that everyone park in the in same direction as flow of traffic by parking on the right side of the road with your right-hand wheels parallel to the curb.
